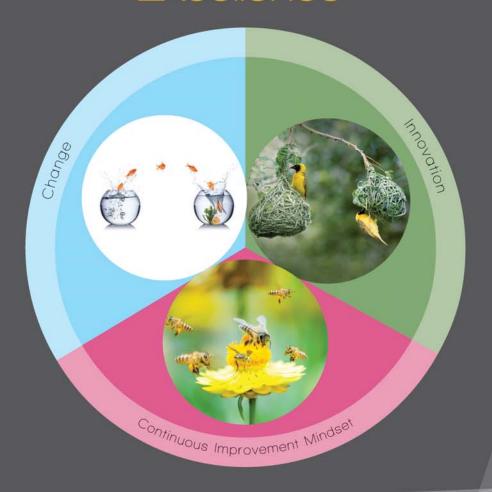

Directors' Review

On behalf of the Board of Directors I am pleased to present the performance review of your Company together with the un-audited financial statements for the first quarter ended September 30, 2016.

Company's Operating Performance

The Company produced 45,869 metric tons during the quarter under review (July-September 2016) as compared to 44,920 metric tons of the corresponding quarter of last year. The capacity utilization for the quarter under review stood at 76%.

Sales Review

The Company sold 44,886 metric tons of its products for the quarter under review (July-September 2016) as compared to 40,100 metric tons of the corresponding quarter of last year showing an increase of 12%. Additional sales volumes have been achieved by downward revision of the selling prices of different products. Resultantly, in terms of value, the net sales of the Company for the quarter under review (July-September 2016) increased to Rs. 3,214 million as compared to Rs. 3,056 million of the corresponding quarter of last year showing an increase of 5%.

Financial Performance

For the quarter under review (July-September 2016), the Company posted gross profit of Rs. 261 million as compared to Rs. 211 million of the corresponding quarter of last year registering an increase of 24%. The increase in gross profit is mainly because of additional sales volumes.

The net operating profit for the quarter under review (July-September 2016) is recorded at Rs. 154 million as compared to Rs. 101 million of the corresponding quarter of last year.

After taking into account financial charges of Rs. 104 million the Company has posted a profit before tax of Rs. 50 million as compared to loss before tax of Rs. 4 million for the corresponding quarter of last year.

After accounting for tax, the Company has made a Profit of Rs. 35 million for the quarter under review as compared to a Loss of Rs. 3 million for the corresponding quarter of the last year.

Directors' Review

Earnings per Share

The basic earnings per share is reported at Rs. 0.13 as compared to basic loss per share of Rs. (0.14) of the comparable quarter of the previous year. There is no dilution effect on the earnings per share for the quarter under review and corresponding quarter of the last year.

Near Term Outlook

Latest rising trend in coal prices in international market is likely to exert pressure on gross margins. Nonetheless management of the Company will continue to focus all its energies to maintain the profitability by further increasing its market share.

We are also optimistic of positive outcome on applications filed by the Company with the NTC for the imposition of anti-dumping duties on paperboard as the issues relating to formation of National Tariff Commission (NTC) has been resolved by the Government.

1. THE COMPANY AND ITS OPERATIONS

Century Paper & Board Mills Limited ("the Company") was incorporated in Pakistan as a public limited company on August 02, 1984 under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 and its ordinary shares are quoted on Pakistan Stock Exchange. The registered office of the Company is situated at Lakson Square Building No. 2, Sarwar Shaheed Road, Karachi, Pakistan. The Company is engaged in manufacturing and marketing of paper, board and related products.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

This condensed interim financial information is unaudited and is being submitted to the shareholders as required under Section 245 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 and the listing regulations of the Pakistan Stock Exchange.

This condensed interim financial information of the Company for the first quarter ended September 30, 2016 has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standard 34 - Interim Financial Reporting and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. In case where requirements differ, the provisions of or directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984 have been followed.

This condensed interim financial information does not include all the information and disclosures required for full annual financial statements and should be read in conjunction with the annual financial statements of the Company as at and for the year ended June 30, 2016 which have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan.

The comparative balance sheet presented in this condensed interim financial information has been extracted from the annual audited financial statements of the Company for the year ended June 30, 2016, whereas the comparative condensed interim profit and loss account, condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim statement of cash flow and condensed interim statement of changes in equity are extracted from the unaudited condensed interim financial information for the first quarter ended September 30, 2015.

2.2 Basis of measurement

This condensed interim financial information has been prepared under the historical cost convention, except for the recognition of certain staff retirement benefits at present value.

This condensed interim financial information has been prepared following accrual basis of accounting except for cash flow information.

2.3 Functional and presentation currency

This condensed interim financial information has been presented in Pak Rupees, which is the functional and presentation currency of the Company.

3. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies adopted and methods of computation followed in the preparation of this condensed interim financial information are same as those for the preceding annual financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2016.

The condensed financial information includes certain disclosures requirements for bifurcation of certain balance sheet and profit and loss items between Conventional and Islamic mode as prescribed by Security and Exchange Commission of Pakistan (SECP) through its circular number 21 of 2016 dated September 05, 2016.

4. ESTIMATES AND JUDGMENTS

The preparation of condensed interim financial information requires management to make certain judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. The significant judgments made by management in applying the Company's accounting policies and key sources of estimation of uncertainty are the same as those that were applied to the financial statements for the year ended June 30, 2016.

5. TAXATION

a) Guarantees

Guarantees have been issued by banks on behalf of the Company in the normal course of business aggregating to Rs. 447 million (June 30, 2016: Rs. 447 million).

Sales tax

Three cases of inadmissible input sales tax amounting to Rs. 82.27 million have been adjudicated against the Company by Deputy Commissioner Inland Revenue. The appeals were filed by the Company against these orders at respective forum. These cases have been remanded back to the adjudicating authorities by the Appellate Authorities with the direction to verify compliance with the relevant provision of the Sales Tax Act, 1990. No provision has been made in the condensed interim financial information as the management is of the opinion, based on advice of tax advisor, that the decision is likely to be in the favor of the Company.

c) Gas Infrasturcture Development Cess - GIDC

Sui Northern Gas Pipeline Limited has charged an amount of Rs. 90.64 million (June 30, 2016 Rs. 70.83 million) on account of late payment surcharge on GIDC of Rs. 399.20 million (Note 17.1) payable in respect of Gas Infrastructure Development Cess (GIDC) levied under GIDC Act, 2015. The Sindh High Court has granted stay order against collecting GIDC under the Act pending the final decision on the writ petition filed by the Company. No provision has been made in these financial statements for late payment surcharge as the management is of the opinion, based on advice of legal advisor, that the stay has been granted by the Sindh High Court against collecting GIDC under the Act, therefore, the Company is not liable to pay late payment surcharges and expected that the decision is likely to be in the favor of the Company.

- Letters of credit other than for capital expenditure amounted to Rs. 882.5 million (June 30, 2016: Rs. 702.52 million).
