DIRECTORS REPORT

The Directors of your company are pleased to present before you the un-audited interim final statements for the 3rd Quarter ended on March 31, 2014.

The turnover for 9 months is Rs. 2.325 Billion as compared to Rs. 4.226 Billion for the corresponding period of last year. The net (loss) for the 9 month is Rs.(12.950) Million compared to net profit of Rs.19.206 Million for the same period of last year.

The decrease in turnover is attributed to the following factors:-

- 1. The Mills remained closed for 1, 1/2 Month during this quarter mainly for reason #2 explained below.
- Our major sales are in export market and China has been the major buyer. Unfortunately export to China has come to stand still.
- The entire Textile Industry is passing through this depression phase and prices in local market have gone down due to oversupply in the local market.
- Duty Free import of yarn from neighboring country has further reduced the demand from local spinners on the basis of cost benefit.
- Increase in power price, increase in minimum wages, and dwindling down Pak rupee parity rate have further eroded our profit ability.

EARNING PER SHARE

The earning (Loss) per share for the period ended on March 31, 2014 is Rs.(0.73) compared to Rs. 1.09 of the corresponding period in previous year.

FUTURE OUTLOOK

We don't see any promising growth or recovery in near future unless some drastic changes are made by the government to boost the textile/spinning industry.

Our Global competitors are enjoying subsidies and availability of basic needs for the industry from their Government. The absence of such facilities in Pakistan has caused Pakistani exporters at inconvenience position in the Global market. We all know that Textile industry is the major contributor to earn foreign exchange. On the basis of current challenges to the industry, and poor economy, the textile industry need BMR particularly for the old plants. This seriously needs textile investment support fund and technology upgradation fund or similar incentives to make the industry viable and Globally competitive.

1 LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

Shadman Cotton Mills Ltd. (the Company) was incorporated in Pakistan on November 24, 1979 under the Companies Act, 1913 (Now the Companies Ordinance 1984). The shares of the Company are listed on Karachi and Lahore Stock Exchange. The registered office of the Company is located at 58, Albumra Housing Society, Block 7/8, Tipu Sultan Road, off. Shaheed-e-Millat Road, Karachi (Previously 201-202, 2nd Floor, Commerce Centre, Hasrat Mohani Road, Karachi) and its mills are located at Feroze Watwan. The Company is principally engaged in manufacturing and sale of yarn.

2 BASIS OF PREPARATION

2.1 Statement of compliance

This condensed interim financial information is un-audited and has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the International Accounting Standards IAS 34* Interim Financial Reporting* as applicable in Pakistan. This condensed interim financial information does not include all of the information and disclosures required for Annual Financial Statements, and should be read in conjunction with the financial statements of the Company for the year ended 30th June, 2013.

This condensed interim financial information is being submitted to the shareholders as required by the Listing Regulations of Karachi & Lahore Stock Exchanges and section 245 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984.

These condensed interim financial information comprise of condensed interim balance sheet, condensed interim profit and loss account, condensed interim statement of comprehensive income, condensed interim cash flow statement and condensed interim statement of changes in equity together with the notes for the nine month ended March 31, 2014 which have been subjected to a review but not audited. These condensed interim financial information also include the condensed interim profit and loss account for the quarter ended March 31, 2014.

3 SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- 3.1 The accounting policies and methods of computation which have been used in the preparation of this condensed interim financial information are the same as those applied in preparation of the financial statements for the proceeding year ended June 30,2013 Except note #3.3
- 3.2 Amendments to certain existing standards and new interpretations on approved accounting standards effective during the period either was not relevant to the Company's operations or did not have any impact on the accounting policies of the Company. As otherwise disclosed.
- .3 During the period, the company has adopted IAS 19, (Revised) 'Employee Benefits'. The amendments in the revised standard require the company to eliminate the corridor approach and recognize all actuarial gain and losses (now called 'remeasurements', that result from the remeasurement of defined benefits obligations and fair value of plan assets at the balance sheet date) in other comprehensive income as they occur, immediately recognize all past service costs and replace interest cost and expected return on plan assets with a net interest amount that is calculated by applying the discount rate to the net defined benefits liability/asset.

This change in accounting policy has been accounted for retrospectively as required under international Accounting standard-8 'Accounting policies, Change in Accounting Estimates and Errors', and the comparative financial statements have been prepared accordingly.

The changes in the accounting policy on the interim financial statement have no effect on the balance sheet as the company has policy of recognizing all actuarial gains or losses arising at each valuation date immediately in profit and loss account. However the amendments in IAS 19, (Revised) 'Employee Benefits', require to recognize the actuarial gain or loss in other comprehensive income instead of profit and loss account., hence the effect based on the relevant available actuarial valuation on the financial statement have been summarized below:
